UMatrix For Chrome

Keymacro is a Chrome Extension that allows you to insert special codes directly from the keyboard to stop websites from blocking web content you want to access. Keymacro also features a dictionary editor, which allows you to view the codes and images and has a built-in time display to show the number of days left until the expiration of the code. This Chrome Extension allows you to add up to six codes from the Keymacro dictionary and the website you are visiting will now allow you to continue with your browsing, even if the website you are on is blocked. It also has a built-in time reminder to tell you when it is about to expire, so you can be sure to update it regularly. The extension works in both incognito and regular browsing and can work with or without scripts, depending on your needs. How to use Keymacro: Step 1: Launch the extension and go to the 'Codes' section to add your new code Step 2: On the 'Keymacro Editor' button, locate the code and image you wish to add from the dictionary and click on the 'Add' button. Once you've added the code and image, you can use the editor to rename and customize it by changing the name, image and color of the code itself Step 3: You will now be prompted with the 'Next' button, which you can use to activate your new code. Step 4: The code will now be displayed on the bottom of the browser, and will stop the website you are on from blocking web content you want to access. Free version is limited to 12 codes For an even more advanced feature, the free version of Keymacro gives you a limited number of codes. Once you have enough codes, you can upgrade to the Pro version, which allows you to save, copy, export and share the codes and also gives you access to an advanced dictionary with more options. Once you're done with your current session, you can also save all the codes to the QR code section of Keymacro and you can access them at any time from the 'Codes' section. The 'Codes' section also displays all the saved codes and their expiration dates. If you're using the Pro version, you can use the app to send codes to your friends. It lets you know if a website is tracking you, what information it collects about your browsing, and if it's sharing that data with any other entities. The add-on is not affiliated with the other uMatrix, uBlock Origin or Privacy Badger projects. uMatrix is distributed under the terms of the MIT license.
